EC welcomes SC verdict, will send list of deleted voters to competent authority

New Delhi: The Election Commission shall, as directed by the Supreme Court, forward the list of electors deleted as part of the special intensive revision (SIR) across 13 states — primarily those classified as ‘others’, separate from the absent, shifted, dead, duplicate (ASDD) electors and, thus, of ‘suspect’ citizenship as well as the ones excluded from the roll based on adjudication during which they could not explain logical discrepancies in their mapping with the roll from last SIR — to the competent authority under the Citizenship Act 1955, for examining their citizenship.

EC officials welcomed the judgement, saying SIR and all

its processes, including seeking further clarification from electors based on logical discrepancies — mismatch with father’s name, gender mismatch, being over 45 years but never enrolled, being one of over six progeny of the

same parent, less than 15 years or over 50 years age gap with mapped parent and less than 40 years gap with mapped grandparent — and deleting ones who failed to explain the discrepancies, have been validated by SC. Those chal-

lenging SIR had earlier called these logical discrepancies an exercise in disenfranchisement.

“The EC was, is and will always be with the voters,” said chief election commissioner Gyanesh Kumar.

As per EC data for a dozen states covered in the second round of SIR, nearly 6.5 crore ASDD electors were deleted. Over 12.7 lakh were excluded from the roll and classified as ‘others’, which sources said are essentially “suspect illegal immigrants”. Another 63.2 lakh were deleted through Form 7 and adjudication; these include over 27 lakh dropped from the Bengal roll after their appeals were rejected by officers.

The SC direction to EC to handover the ‘suspect’ citizen

cases to the competent authority under the Citizenship Act was already there in the SIR order. The order had instructed the electoral registration officer (ERO) and assistant ERO to “forward cases of suspected foreign nationals to the ‘competent authority’ under the Citizenship Act, 1955”. Sources said the competent authority is the foreigners registration office (FRO) or foreigners regional registration office (FRRO), and the ERO/SDM may forward the ‘suspect’ cases to them for verification. In case the citizenship is verified, the FRO/FRRO may refer back the case to EC authorities who will then add the person to the roll. Else, the FRO/FRRO may order the suspect to be sent to a detention or holding centre.

SC verdict clearing EC on SIR is full of contradictions: Cong

New Delhi: Congress on Wednesday slammed the SC judgment on SIR for not mentioning a clutch of “major flaws and contradictions” in EC’s process that, it said, has “deprived crores of citizens”



Congress spokesperson Abhishek Singhvi told a press conference that SIR has raised serious questions about the credibility of elections, as up to 80% of challenges to voters’ exclusion in West Bengal have been found to be successful till now. He said if this success rate holds, then millions of voters may have been deprived of their voting rights in the recent polls.

Singhvi said the judg-

ment is riddled with contradictions, as it did not mention glaring errors and flaws in the SIR process noticed over the past few months in different states. He said SC had ruled Aadhaar was not a proof of citizenship and EC could not adjudicate on it, but lakhs were excluded from rolls on the issue of citizenship based on 7-8 documents that SIR demanded, like ration card and parents date of birth. Similarly, he said EC had imposed an excessively short deadline for SIR for crores of persons, which led to massive exclusions, while elections were held before they could be adjudicated upon. “It is an issue the court should have pondered over,” TMC MP Kalyan Banerjee said the judgment was confined to the Bihar case and could not be treated as an all-India ruling, asserting issues raised in Bengal were “completely different”.

Queue of B’desh illegals fleeing WB grows longer

Swarupnagar/Siliguri: Bangladeshi who had lived in Bengal for years — some for decades, armed with Aadhaar cards, ration cards and voter IDs — gathered in growing numbers Wednesday at the Bithari-Hakimpur border checkpoint in North 24 Parganas district to return home as the authorities tightened the net on illegal immigrants, report Sanjib Chakraborty & Roshan Gupta.

Families carrying bags, utensils and documents queued up near the border fencing as Bengal’s “detect-delete-deport” drive widened across districts. Among them were many removed from rolls during SIR.

Authorities opened three “holding centres” — detention facilities to handle swelling numbers and carry out background checks and document verification, sources said. BJP MLA Anandamay Barman said large-scale infiltration took place during TMC’s 15-year govt. “Infiltrators have deprived locals of their rights and altered demographic balance.”

New Delhi: Buoyed by the SC’s endorsement of SIR, which has received flak from the opposition, BJP said Congress has encountered “total defeat” and targeted Rahul Gandhi for travelling to Car



Nicobar and Vietnam during elections and then looking for a scapegoat in EC after his party’s losses. “Opposition’s efforts to cover up its political incompetence by tainting all democratic institutions today proved unsuccessful and ineffective on the floor of the Supreme Court,” BJP spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi said, especially blaming Congress and Rahul for stirring a controversy over the SIR of electoral rolls.

He said opposition parties, particularly Congress, had already suffered political defeat in elections and moral defeat as well due to the absence

of popular support for their attempt to trigger anarchy in the country over the issue. They have now suffered a constitutional defeat as well, he told reporters.

He said the SC verdict has “destroyed” the very basis of opposition to the exercise.

Amid scenes of suspected infiltrators leaving West Bengal for Bangladesh fearing a crackdown by the BJP govt, Trivedi said this has only validated his party’s stand and pointed out that some of them had admitted on camera to voting in previous polls. He said, “The true character of the opposition alliance has now been exposed — it is anti-Sanatana Dharma and protective of infiltrators.”

Pick 50 cities and make them 100% clean, PM Modi tells officials

New Delhi: Chairinga Pragati meeting on Wednesday, PM Narendra Modi told the housing and urban affairs ministry officials to first identify 50 cities and achieve 100% cleanliness in them in all aspects, from making them garbage free to processing all their solid and liquid waste, reports Dipak Dash.

TOI has learnt Modi suggested the ministry and state

govts collaborate to demonstrate this as an example while continuing their efforts to make cities cleaner. The ministry made a detailed presentation on progress of Swachh Bharat Mission Urban 2.0.

The PMO said Modi emphasised the need for effective implementation of the mission while underlining that it should move beyond infrast-

structure creation and ensure measurable outcomes through regular monitoring and citizen participation. Officials said that while reviewing progress of railway projects, Modi expressed his unhappiness over the delay in their implementation due to the identification of issues at a later stage, and also over the delay in the release of compensation. “The

PM asked why responsibility should not be fixed in such cases,” said an official.

Reviewing a road and port connectivity project for Vadha- van port in Maharashtra, the PM said it should be executed as a model of port-led, multimodal development, where every major mode of transport is seamlessly integrated to create a future-ready logistics eco-

system. “He suggested the shipping ministry transport materials for development of the greenfield port rather than waiting for the road link to be completed,” said one official.

PM also stressed innovative use of canal networks, including the installation of solar panels along canals and over canals for clean power generation.

Shah: Raze illegal structures near Pak border in Raj

Jaipur: Union home minister Amit Shah has ordered demolition of all unauthorised structures within 15km of the border with Pakistan in Rajasthan, directing authorities to intensify action against infiltration, narcotics smuggling, terrorist financing and other cross-border crime networks.

Chairing a high-level security review meeting in Bikaner Tuesday, Shah assessed security arrangements in Rajasthan’s five border districts — Bikaner, Jaisalmer, Barmer, Sriganganagar and Phalodi — in the presence of CMBhajan Lal Sharma, senior state officials, district magistrates and SPs.

Shah called for strict enforcement of a “zero-tolerance policy” on illegal construction near the international border and directed officials to clear the entire 0-15km belt. Authorities said the exercise is aimed at curbing illegal activity across sensitive border zones.

The meeting also cleared plans for a “360-degree security framework” for frontier districts, involving residents, state agencies and central forces to

tighten integrated border management.

Shah ordered closer coordination among BSF, Narcotics Control Bureau, Central Board of Direct Taxes and state authorities to tackle infiltration, drug trafficking, encroachment, smuggling, fake Aadhaar cards, mule bank accounts and shell companies allegedly linked to terrorist funding and economic offences.

DMs were asked to ensure banks comply with financial regulations and verify funding sources of major business establishments operating in border areas. Officials were directed to monitor emerging crime patterns and networks tied to narcotics and organised smuggling.

Man morphs video of actor, booked

Hyderabad: A YouTube channel operator has been booked for allegedly circulating false information by uploading a morphed video of a Tollywood actor.

In his complaint to the Jubilee Hills police on May 21, advocate M Ramakrishna alleged that YouTube channel “moviemystery-u7z” intentionally created and circulated morphed visuals portraying the actor with a bald head and an unhealthy appearance.

“The morphed visuals were accompanied by captions and fabricated statements that he lost 60 kg due to an unknown illness. The claims were baseless, malicious and not supported by any authentic medical source or official confirmation,” the complainant, a resident of Srinagar Colony, alleged.

The complainant alleged the channel was created to damage the actor’s reputation, cause emotional distress among fans and attract attention through sensational content. He submitted screenshots and channel information to police.

Since the allegations were non-cognisable in nature, police referred the complaint to court. **TNN**

₹1,150cr cocaine seized, 3 arrested; Brazil to Delhi drug trail exposed

Ahmedabad: In one of the biggest maritime anti-narcotics crackdowns in the country, a joint team of Gujarat ATS and the Indian Coast Guard has seized 115kg of cocaine worth Rs 1,150 crore in the international market, uncovering an international syndicate operating through sea routes from Latin America to India. Gujarat DGP K L N Rao said the drug cache was seized from cargo vessel MV Europe anchored near Mundra port in Kutch district. “Three foreign nationals allegedly linked to the smuggling network were arrested. A fourth suspect, believed to be a Tanzanian national, jumped into the sea during the operation and is feared drowned,” Rao said. **TNN**
